FREEDOM OF INFORMATION – LOWER LIMB AMPUTATIONS

I write in response to your request for information in relation to lower limb amputations.

Question:

- The number of lower limb amputations carried out within the health board in children and adult populations who also have :-
 1. A mental health condition,
 2. A physical and/or sensory disability,
 3. A learning disability,
 4. Autism / neurodiverse

Notes

The numbers shown are where the following codes have been coded within the same inpatient stay

OPCS4 codes:

X09.- Amputation of leg or X12.- Operations on amputation stump

ICD10 codes:

Mental health: all starting with 'F'

learning disability: F80.- to F89.-

Autism code: F84. -

Sensory disability: Deafness H91.9 or Sight loss H54.-

Please note that 'F' code figures will be duplicated within the table across the different categories (not possible to separate).

To protect the identity of the individuals involved any figure of 5 or less has not been shown in the table above. Since we do not have their consent to release this data from their records,

the information is exempt under section 38(1)(b) of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act i.e. to provide it would breach the Data Protection Act (2018).

I hope the information provided helps with your request.

If you are unhappy with our response to your request, you do have the right to request us to review it. Your request should be made within 40 working days of receipt of this letter, and we will reply within 20 working days of receipt. If our decision is unchanged following a review and you remain dissatisfied with this, you then have the right to make a formal complaint to the Scottish Information Commissioner within 6 months of receipt of our review response. You can do this by using the Scottish Information Commissioner's Office online appeals service at www.itspublicknowledge.info/Appeal. If you remain dissatisfied with the Commissioner's response you then have the option to appeal to the Court of Session on a point of law.

If you require a review of our decision to be carried out, please write to the FOI Reviewer at the email address at the head of this letter. The review will be undertaken by a Reviewer who was not involved in the original decision-making process.
