Please could I have the following information for 2019/20, 2020/21, 2021/22, 2022/23, 2023/24 - broken down by year:

1. How many referrals have been made by GPs for assessments for ADHD for a) children and b) adults

2. How many referrals have been made by GPs for assessments for autism for a) children and b) adults

I understand that the board may not specify the neurodevelopmental conditions which referrals have been made in relation to. In this case, could you please provide the total number of referrals from GPs for all neurodevelopmental assessments in general in a) children and b) adults across these years?

Answer:

Data is not recorded separately for ADHD and ASD assessment. Children under the age of 7 are referred to the community paediatrics Child Development teams for ASD assessment. The data given below is for all neurodevelopmental referrals for adults, all ADHD referrals for children under the age of 18 and ASD referrals for children aged 7-18, and all referrals for children aged up to 7 years for Child Development assessment.

Before 2023, adult referrals for neurodevelopmental assessments were added to the general adult mental health waiting lists and therefore neurodevelopmental cases for patients who were seen for assessment prior to this date cannot be identified. The data included for 2022 is for patients still waiting when the waiting list changes were made, but the data for this year should be regarded as incomplete.

The data given below is for all neurodevelopmental referrals for adults, all ADHD referrals for children under the age of 18, and ASD referrals for children aged 7-18. We are not able to give a specific waiting time for children under the age of 7 years referred to community paediatrics child development, as there are different waiting times for different stages of assessment.
