## FREEDOM OF INFORMATION - NEUROLOGICAL CHARITY FUNDING

I write in response to your request for information in relation to neurological charity funding provided by NHS Lothian.

## Question:

How much funding has NHS Lothian has provided to neurological third sector organisations over the last 5 years? Specifically, groups that primarily deal with epilepsy (Epilepsy Scotland, Epilepsy Connections, Quarriers (non-clinical funding)), cerebral palsy (Cerebral Palsy Scotland), multiple sclerosis (MS Society Scotland), Parkinsons (Parkinsons UK) and motor neuron disease (MND Scotland).

In the last five years NHS Lothian has only made payment to one of these organisations. Details are in the table below as requested:

If you remain dissatisfied with the Commissioner's response you then have the option to appeal to the Court of Session on a point of law.
