# FREEDOM OF INFORMATION - OVERDOSE AND UNDER 18S

I write in response to your request for information in relation to overdoes and under 18s.

# Question:

1. How many children (aged under 18) have been treated for overdoses at hospitals in your board area involving paracetamol in 2022, 2023, 2024 and 2025 to date? Could this age be presented by year, intent (accidental and deliberate) and by age.

To protect the identity of the individuals involved any figure of 5 or less has not been shown in the table above. Since we do not have their consent to release this data from their records, the information is exempt under section 38(1)(b) of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act i.e. to provide it would breach the Data Protection Act (2018).

### Question:

2. How many children (aged under 18) have been treated for overdoses at hospitals in your board areainvolving illicit substances in 2022, 2023, 2024 and 2025 to date? Could this age be presented by year, intent (accidental and deliberate) and by age.

### Answer:

I am advised that it is not possible to separate figures for illicit from non-illicit substances. Under the Freedom of Information Act NHS Lothian is not required to create new records to enable it to respond to your enquiry. This information is not collated or held in aggregate form and it would be necessary to review all case files relating to patients over the period you have requested to assemble the information you seek. Even if NHS Lothian did this – and there would be significant cost implications in doing so – it would be unable to respond in full to your request. The information requested is therefore exempt under section 12.1 – Cost.

- 1. Table one presents patients attending A&E where the main diagnosis code was 'Paracetomol overdose'. Only one code is entered per attendance record, therefore not included in the data are records where the main diagnosis was something other than 'Paracetomol overdose' and yet paracetomol was an additional factor in the attendance.
- 2. Patients are included once per year and age group. Therefore individal patients may appear more than once in the data, should they have attended across multiple years and/or at different ages.
- 3. It is not possible to dicern intent (accidental/deliberate) from A&E attendance data, therefore this information has not been provided for question 1.
- 4. It is not possible to dicern illicit from non-illicit substances, therefore no information can be provided for question 2.

I hope the information provided helps with your request.

If you are unhappy with our response to your request, you do have the right to request us to review it. Your request should be made within 40 working days of receipt of this letter, and we will reply within 20 working days of receipt. If our decision is unchanged following a review and you remain dissatisfied with this, you then have the right to make a formal complaint to the Scottish Information



Commissioner within 6 months of receipt of our review response. You can do this by using the Scottish Information Commissioner's Office online appeals service at <a href="https://www.itspublicknowledge.info/Appeal">www.itspublicknowledge.info/Appeal</a>. If you remain dissatisfied with the Commissioner's response you then have the option to appeal to the Court of Session on a point of law.

If you require a review of our decision to be carried out, please write to the FOI Reviewer at the email address at the head of this letter. The review will be undertaken by a Reviewer who was not involved in the original decision-making process.
