FREEDOM OF INFORMATION – MATERNITY UNIT

I write in response to your request for information in relation to NHS Lothian's Maternity units.

Question:

1. When was the last time your health board maternity ward/unit was updated or refurbished?

Answer:

There has not been a full refurbishment of the maternity unit at the Royal Infirmary of Edinburgh since it opened in 2003. Redecoration and smaller updates are completed as required.

The labour ward at St John's Hospital was refurbished and upgraded in 2015.

Question:

2. Does every birthing suite have an ensuite toilet and shower facility?

Answer:

All birthing suites have ensuite toilet facilities, but some labour ward rooms have a bath rather than a shower.

Question:

3. Does every postnatal suite have an ensuite toilet and shower facility?

Answer:

All postnatal suites have ensuite toilets, but some single rooms have a bath rather than a shower.

Question:

4. Does every multi-bed room/bay have an ensuite toilet and shower facility?

Answer:

No, the 3 bed HDU room in the labour ward at the Royal Infirmary does not have ensuite toilet or shower facilities.

5. What is the furthest distance someone must walk to get from their bed to a toilet and shower within the maternity ward?

Answer:

The furthest distance is 7 metres.
