Figures are reported for patients who were removed after being seen (i.e. attended the scheduled appointment) and those removed not seen (e.g. removal after not attending, multiple cancellations, no longer requiring to be seen, failing to contact the service when invited to book an appointment etc)
- 4. Removal figures include patients removed from assessment and treatment waiting lists.
