2. Can you provide a breakdown of how much was spent on each variety of pest, broken down in the same way?

Answer:

This is not a level of detail which is readily available to provide and would involve individually reviewing circa 650 invoices to then manually collate by spend, by pest.

Under the Environmental Information Regulations NHS Lothian is not required to create new records to enable it to respond to your enquiry. This information is not collated or held in aggregate form and it would be necessary to review all finance ledgers relating to pest control over the period you have requested to assemble the information you seek. Even if NHS Lothian did this – and there would be significant cost implications in doing so – it would be unable to respond in full to your request. The information requested is therefore exempt under Regulation 10(4)(b) – Manifestly unreasonable request.
