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



Inequalities in Covid19 mortality

Covid-19 age standardised mortality rates by deprivation, Scotland, to end 2020




- Frontline employment
- Overcrowded housing
- Communication barriers
- Pre-existing morbidity
- Poverty



Pathways

- Economic impacts
 - Workplace closures, loss of work, workers isolating/childcare, business closures
- Mental health impacts
 - Social isolation, fear, anxiety
- Family impacts
 - Family violence, loss of education
- Health related behaviours
- Disruption to services
 - Healthcare, other essential services
- Transport and greenspace
- Communities
 - Social disorder, community responses



The syndemic of COVID-19, non-communicable diseases (NCDs) and the social determinants of health



Syndemic:

‘closely intertwined and mutually enhancing health problems that significantly affect the overall health status of a population within the context of a perpetuating configuration of noxious social conditions’

- Heat Stress




- Vectors, food and waterborne disease

- Impacts of policy responses


SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS



The model of the 'Relationship – Public Health and Sustainable Development' (Kickbusch 2010).




Just Transition recommendations and health



Investment in warmer homes

- Strong evidence of links between warm, energy efficient housing and health
 - Fuel poverty and income
 - Nutrition and food preparation
 - Physical activity
 - Educational attainment
 - Social support
- Impact on house prices and rents
- Employment opportunities
- Inequalities – vulnerability to cold, urban/rural differences, low income, children

Buses and transport electrification

- Strong links between transport and health – multiple adverse impacts from private car traffic:
 - Air quality
 - Physical inactivity
 - Severance and social connections
 - Injuries
 - Use of public space
- Low confidence in public transport during pandemic
- Inequalities – populations without private car access, rural areas, wider community effects of traffic
- Issues – cost of fares, accessibility, other shared transport, cost and impacts of electric cars

Jobs and skills development, rural development

- Negative impact of unemployment and health
- Issues from rural development:
 - Population movement
 - Community psychosocial impacts
 - Infrastructure demands – traffic, housing, water, services
- Inequalities – younger and older people at higher risk of unemployment and impacts of unemployment
